NOTES:

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both ACC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements.
2. Courses with an asterisk (*) satisfy the Business Field of Study (FOS) curriculum. This guide is "FOS Complete."
3. Nine hours of designated "writing intensive" (WI) courses must be completed at Texas State to satisfy degree requirements.
4. This transfer planning guide shows a suggested course of study at both institutions. Students may want to consider taking select courses in summer semesters instead, provided that they are offered and are in the correct sequence needed for their degree and major program.
5. If two years of the same foreign language were not completed in high school, students must take 6-8 hours of the same foreign language.
6. Texas State will apply to a specific degree no more than 66 semester hours from an accredited junior/community college (at the approval of the individual dean, 6-8 hours may be added).
7. Upon completion of certain course requirements at Texas State, students may elect to send these hours back to ACC to be applied toward an associate's degree. This is commonly referred to as "reverse transfer."

TEXAS STATE ADMISSION PROCEDURES

MCCOY COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION ADMISSION:

Admission to the McCoy College is competitive, and admission requirements are beyond those for Texas State. As a result, a student may be admitted to Texas State, but denied admission to the McCoy College. The student must be admitted to the McCoy College to pursue a degree program under the college.

Transfer students to the McCoy College are students who have completed at least 30 transferable semester hours (either at Texas State or another college or university), including English 1310, English 1320, and Math 1329. **Admission to the McCoy College of Business Administration is competitive and based upon the number of spaces or openings available. A competitive index is calculated using the grades from ENG 1310, ENG 1320, MATH 1329 (or their equivalents) and the overall GPA from all colleges and universities attended. Students are automatically admitted if they have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher. All other applicants will be considered for remaining spaces or openings through a review process.**

To apply to McCoy College you must select the business major of your choice as your first major option on the Texas Common Application. The application deadlines for admission to the McCoy College are:

October 15 for Spring semesters

March 15 for Summer/ Fall semesters

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:

For general university admission, students must submit a completed Texas Common Application form, \$40 application fee, and official transcripts from each institution attended to the Texas State Undergraduate Admissions Office. Students must submit an application for on-campus housing, if required, or apply to live off campus.

Students transferring directly to Texas State University-San Marcos from a community college may elect to follow the Texas State catalog in effect at the time they entered the community college, or any subsequent catalog upon approval of the Dean of their College. Students are reminded to refer to their designated catalog for information relating to the University and the McCoy College requirements for curriculum, graduation, probation/suspension, and other general information.
