<sup>5</sup> Select one course from the following: PHIL 2303, COSC 1300, any additional 3-4 hour college level Math course beyond the Math taken for the core, or any additional 3-4 hour Natural Science beyond the two core Natural Science courses taken for the core.  
<sup>6</sup> Select one course from the Visual and Performing Arts component area (050) of ACC's Core Curriculum.

**NOTES:**

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both ACC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements. Courses in (parentheses) indicate the course transfer equivalents at Texas State.
2. Texas State will apply a maximum of 72 hours from accredited two-year colleges toward a MC degree program offered at the RRHEC.
3. Students may elect to complete courses in a different sequence where possible, but should consult a counselor/advisor before doing so.
4. Upon completion of certain course requirements at Texas State, students may elect to send these hours back to ACC to be applied toward an associate's degree. This is commonly referred to as "reverse transfer."

## **TEXAS STATE ADMISSION PROCEDURES**

---

### **UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:**

1. Submit completed Texas Common Application form, \$40 application fee, and all credentials to the Undergraduate Admissions Office by the stated deadline (Fall-July 1, Spring-December 1, Summer I-May 1, Summer II-June 15).
2. Submit an official transcript from each institution attended to the Undergraduate Admissions Office. Students must be eligible to return (e.g., free of suspension, dismissal, or enforced withdrawal) to all previous institutions regardless of grade point average (GPA) or degrees received.
3. A minimum 2.25 grade point average (GPA) in all transferable courses is required. In computing the GPA, grades of "A", "B", "C", "D", and "F" are computed as recorded. Grades of "W", "P", "Q", and "X" are disregarded and grades of "WF" and "I" are averaged as "F". Grades in non-transferable and technical/vocational courses are disregarded.

Students transferring directly to Texas State University-San Marcos from a two-year college may elect to follow the Texas State catalog in effect at the time they entered the two-year college, or any subsequent catalog upon approval of the Dean of their College. Students are reminded to refer to their designated catalog for information relating to University, College, and/or School requirements for curriculum, graduation, probation/suspension, and other general information.

### **SCHOOL OF JOURNALISM AND MASS COMMUNICATION ADMISSION:**

Students who meet the requirements outlined below, will be admitted in full-major status. Students who fail to meet the requirements will not be admitted to the major.

- A letter grade of a "C" or higher in the following courses or their equivalents: ENG 1310, ENG 1320, COMM 1310, and MC 1301.
- An overall GPA of at least a 2.50 on a 4.00 scale.
- A passing score on the school's grammar, spelling, and punctuation (GSP) test.
- Students who have not met the university's computer literacy requirement will need to complete CS 1308 or its equivalent with a letter grade of "C" or higher.
